


Top tips for reading!

Questions to chat about

With the new Read, Write, Inc book bag books, once your child has read the story, use the **'questions to think/chat about'** at the back of the book. It is important that they listen to the question carefully and then find the answer on each page.

Questions to chat about

Read the questions aloud to your child and ask him or her to find the answers on the relevant pages. Do not ask your child to read the questions – the words are harder than he or she can read at the moment.

- p.4 What does Beth's shop have lots of?
- p.6 Does Beth sell egg and chips?
- p.8 What makes Beth say "Yum yum"?
- p.9 What does Beth think is the best way of having chips?

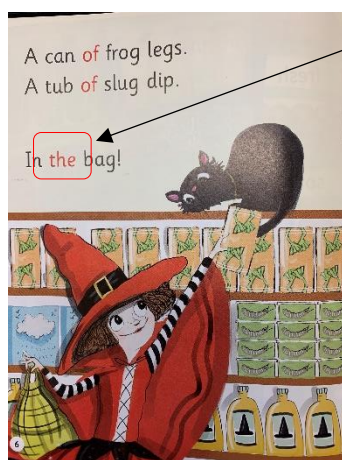


You could ask them what they enjoyed about the story too!

Red Words

Once you have practised the red words at the front of the book, see how many you can find in the text.

They are always red.



These are tricky words and cannot be sounded out. The more practise reading these words, the better!
