Social Media & Age Restrictions

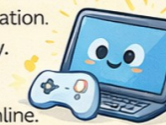
Most social media platforms like TikTok, Instagram, and Snapchat have age restrictions. (usually 13+) to help protect young people from seeing things that are not suitable for their age.

- Children under **13** should not have social media accounts.
- Make sure your child knows to **never** share personal information online.
- Teach children how to set their profiles to private and be selective about who they add as friends or followers.



Top Tips

- ✓ Supervise children on any device with internet access.
- ✓ Talk to children about safe adults if they have problems online
- ✓ Use age-appropriate apps/games.
- ✓ Have parental controls activated.
- ✓ Keep personal information private for your family.
- ✓ Teach children to be kind and respectful online.

Responsible Use of AI

AI can be helpful, but it's important to use it safely and responsibly.

Children should know that not everything they see online is true, even if AI generated it. It's always good to check information with a trusted adult.

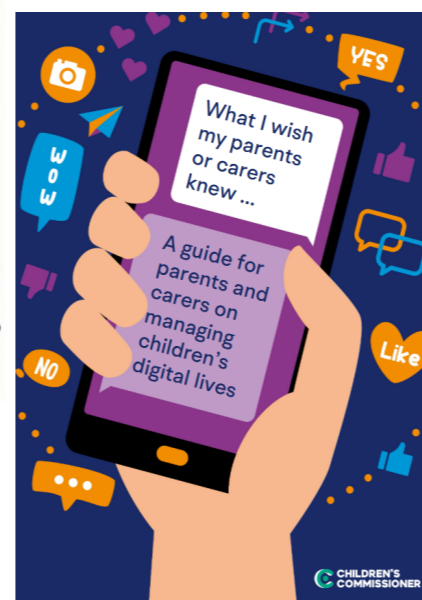
Remember:

- AI can make **mistakes**, so double-check facts together.
- **Think before you click**: not all suggestions from AI are good or safe.
- **Talk to safe adults** if something looks odd or feels wrong.
- We should treat even smart robots kindly and responsibly!



Screen Time

- Primary children in the UK spend an average of 3-4 hours a day.
- Set limits on screen time.
- Consider creating **Tech-Free Zones** in the home.
